**Development of Paper Series to Inform Domestic Resource Mobilization (DRM)  
given the Kenya's Transition in to Low Middle Income Country in Partnership  
with Strathmore Business School (SBS) To be Presented at the Maisha Conference  
2017 to be Held From 28th to 31st May 2017 In Nairobi**

The NACC through the department of HIV Investments, partnered with the Strathmore Business School to jointly establish a global public health platform that will facilitate guest lecturing and presentations of cutting edge research and publications on key HIV policy and technical as one among other objectives.

The partnership further seeks to enhance models that can be used in sustainable HIV financing as well as advice policy. The partnership shall therefore involve modeling and development of paper series in various thematic areas that shall be presented to stakeholders in the health financing and support in Kenya. The management of these partnerships is facilitated through involvement of professionals and policy experts who shall presentations to a team of experts and professionals key in HIV management including HIV Financing.

The Department for HIV Investment and SBS are inviting not more that 5 presentations to be made at Maisha Conference, 2017 to be held in Nairobi from 28th to 31st March 2017 at a satellite session that will also discuss the Sustainable Agenda in HIV and NCDs Financing in Kenya. Each presentation shall not be more than 15 minutes.

### **Specific Objectives of the Technical Assistance (TA) Submitting the Presentation**

This Technical Assistance shall contribute to empirical policy discussion through:

- i. Undertaking literature review based on the topics provided
- ii. Collection of available data and carry out necessary analysis based on the topic provided
- iii. Presentation of the results through a panel to stakeholders in the HIV response sector
- iv. Present to NACC/SBS at the Maisha Conference 2017 a summarized presentation for publishing and dissemination to stakeholders during dissemination.

### **Scope of the Technical Assistance (TA)**

This Technical Assistance is expected to be implemented within the schedule of paper series presentation. It will require the following:-

- i) That the TA review relevant documents based on the provided topic for the paper series
- ii) Develop a research summary with reviewed literature, analysed data and findings and policy recommendations for presentations.
- iii) Participate in a panel and make a 15 minute presentation of the paper in a meeting to stakeholders in the HIV management field comprising of representatives from the private, public and development partners sectors.
- iv) That the TA has undertaken previous work in the topic selected, including publishing in peer journals or book chapters

### **Theme of the Satellite Session**

*Achieving UHC by 2030, is Sustainable Financing for HIV and NCDs Key to Effective Health Governance*

### **The Topics of Discussions in Phase 1 of the Paper Series**

The financing landscape in Kenya has a declining trend and this may not get better with Kenya the country transiting in to Low Middle Income Country (LMIC). In this case, the country should involve professionals and policy experts where key stakeholders in the Private, development partners and public sectors shall be involved in the discussions.

The topics to be discussed within the development and dissemination of the policy papers series shall include:

- i) The Kenya transition to Lower Middle Income Country (LMIC) and HIV Response in relation to the countries' economic and health burden in Kenya
- ii) Costing the adoption of HIV test and treat guidelines in Kenya. What are the implication to Economic Growth
- iii) The contribution of private sector in HIV response. What are lessons learnt, what are the efficiency challenges?
- iv) The cost of HIV treatment in private sector; what are the economic and social benefits in Kenya.
- v) The financing gap models in HIV response and a model review on the sustainable financing scrutiny.

### **Venue of the Presentation**

The presentations shall be held at the Hilton Hotel during the Maisha Conference, 2017. Thereafter, the second phase of the paper series presentations will be held at the Strathmore Business School

## Professional Qualifications

This assignment will require that:

- i. The Technical Assistant (TA) to have over 5 years of professional experience in Investment Analysis, health care financing, Business Growth and Sector development.
- ii. Must be a holder of a Master's degree in Public health with bias in Health care financing and management, Economics with bias in health economics of public sector economics or Business Administration with bias in Health management.
- iii. Must be computer literate, have excellent communication and writing skills, been involved in project management programmes that drive productivity and increase competitiveness
